### **Letter from the President**

Greetings to all of our members,

The summer is drawing to a close and in the Pittsburgh Area you can just now feel the beginning of fall. Football is ramping up and baseball is coming to an end. We are blessed to live in an area where we have a variety of seasons. But we recognize that others around the country are suffering from the ravages of storms of all kinds. Houston in particular has been devastated by a massive storm and its citizens are going to be affected for a long time to come.

One of our primary missions is to support the sea services. A unique mission for them has been very visible during the recent weeks since the storm hit. Houston is home to the key part of the oil industry. During normal times, shipping through the port is nothing less than organized chaos. But losing the port for any length of time no matter what the reason has serious economic consequences beyond just the region. Our Coast Guard assets provided remarkable lifesaving services to the victims of Harvey but also worked to clear the channels as quickly as possible. This small group of Guardsmen has performed with a sense of dedication and urgency despite the fact that many of their families were impacted by the storm.

The Navy and Marines have also been pressed into service. Along with the aircraft (fixed wing and helicopters) two ships have been deployed with Marines and additional assistance. Countless people's lives will be made a lot better because the men and women of the sea services (along with their Guard and Reserve counterparts) are stepping up to help their fellow citizens. This long tradition of support goes back many years because of one thing: the combined forces of the sea services are ready, willing and able to step into whatever crisis response the nation requires. When a massive capacity to respond emerges, the

combined power and resources of the sea services are nearly always a key part of that response.

Our continued support of all of the sea services is more important now than ever. That support includes reminding our elected representatives that we need a strong capability for all of the nation's challenges. In the coming months, that need will surely be tested again.

### Coast Guard Auxiliary Presentation

**Anthony Waters** and Sammy the Otter of the US Coast Guard Auxiliary recently presented a brief discussion on life jackets and the effect of pollution on aquatic ecosystems to a group of about 150 Cub Scouts, parents, and leaders at “Rookie Camp” conducted by the Laurel Highlands Council of the Boy Scouts of America at Heritage Reservation. The discussion surrounded the importance of wearing a personal flotation device. Littering was discussed and the negative impact to both wildlife and people was empathized.

US Coast Guard statistics shows that 509 people drowned in 2015. 83% of these drowning victims did not wear a life jacket. Just by wearing a life jacket, boaters stand a greater chance of survival due to accidental water entry. Accidental water entry may be a result of unexpected maneuvers, unexpected water hazards, or accidents. Even strong swimmers may become disoriented or incapacitated due to falling over board.

Water pollution is an ongoing concern, as it will harm wildlife, tourism, and the economy. The EPA estimates roughly \$1 billion in economic losses. Wildlife may be irrevocably harmed by pollution. Some animals will unknowingly eat tiny pieces of plastic or paper, thinking it is food, causing internal damage to the animal and possibly disrupting the ecosystem. People do not want to swim in water that has garbage floating in it, further distracting from the beauty of our natural resources.

The Scouts, parents, leaders, and staff members in attendance were encouraged to dispose of their trash properly, pick up other

trash they may find, and always wear a life jacket when boating.
